
LAMC Welcomes New Board Members



Never Doubt

ever doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed people can..." As LAMC graduates, we are familiar with this quote, but we're not often aware of the accomplishments realized by groups

and individuals practicing servant leadership in Madison County.

One illustrative story that highlights leadership accomplishments began in 1929 when a group of men from Alexandria formed a local Kiwanis Club. By 1942, Madison County's 4-H Fair permanently moved from Anderson to Alexandria and significant, dedicated, volunteerism from this small group of men transformed the local park into a top quality site for the 4-H Fair which has continued for 71 years except for 1949 when polio shut the fair down. Note that the fair continued even during WWII, a great service for children during trying world events.

Even though this story began in 1929, its message is not about raising money, buying land, and constructing buildings. It's about results. Results represented by positive influence on children.

With countless projects the Kiwanians might have endorsed, sponsoring a 4-H Fair became their dedicated passion. They realized that youth participating in 4-H learn by doing while working alongside adult mentors. All 4-H youth are expected to present completed projects at the fair while modeling leadership, citizenship and life skills. Older youth support younger club members as they become junior leaders. Being a 4-H member is a spring-summer commitment, yet the rewards are life-long.

What other initiative in Madison county has the potential to produce thousands of young servant leaders? What other opportunity do thousands of youth and their families have to work together to build leadership, citizenship, and life skills? Not many. Consider that during one recent year there were 1,094 4-H youth, 178 club leaders, and 41 clubs in Madison County not including adult Home Economics Clubs with life-long members. And, of these 1,094 youth, 330 were from rural homes, 442 from small towns, and 322 from cities! They are not all farm kids! Now, multiply this number by 71 years. Wow!

One last question. Where are these thousands of youth now that they are adults? Might they be community leaders today? Might they even be LAMC graduates too. Never doubt, just look for the results!
